### Sports Day: Tuesday 4<sup>th</sup> July



Sports day will be held from 9:30am – 12pm. From 9:30am the main entrance gate will be open and you can make your way to the school field.

Children will be with staff during this time competing in their events and will not be sitting with parents.

At the end of sports day children will return to their classroom with their class teachers.

From 12pm you are welcome to collect your children from the classroom where the class teacher will sign your child out. Once signed out the children are the responsibility of the parents.

From 12pm we ask that you sit with your child and have a picnic with them. If you have booked a school dinner for your child they will have a take-out lunch to eat with you.

You are then able to go and visit the stalls that have been set up around the outside of school.

Once you have finished looking round the stall you are free to take your children home. Someone will be signing the children out at the main gate for coming in/leaving at the school day.

Any children not with parents will be supervised by staff for the afternoon and can be collected at the end of the day in the usual way.

Can I please remind parents that school is a non-smoking/vaping site. Due to staffing, we will not be able to allow parents on and off the site during the day.

## Move Up Week : Get to know your new teachers.



Week beginning 3<sup>rd</sup> July children will be taught English by their new class teacher.

Week beginning 10<sup>th</sup> July children will be taught Maths by their new class teacher.

This will be an opportunity for your child to get to know their new class teacher over a number of sessions throughout the next two weeks. There will be a mixture of teaching; the children will be taught in their own classroom so they can show the teacher their routines, there will also be time in their new classrooms so they have an opportunity to explore where they will be next year and to ask questions of their new teacher over a couple of weeks.

Those children who will have new teachers in September may not have the opportunity to spend as much time with their new teacher as they have commitments at their existing school, but will be taught by one of our current teachers who will pass all relevant information on.
